Expressing a Story or Song Origami Paper Sculpture

Texture and Form

Unit Overview

This unit is inspired by the work of Cristian Marianciuc. Cristian uses the origami crane form as a starting point for his artwork. He combines texture, color, and shape and other elements of art to convey a memory or mood. At first his goal was to create a crane per day for 365 days, but he didn't stop there. He extended his goal to 1,000, and continues to make unique, expressive cranes as a focus of his work.

Your assignment is to convey a personal story, memory, tradition, or song using paper and an origami form as a starting point. You will be graded on both the storytelling aspect of the work and your use of the elements of texture and form. You are welcome to include more elements or principles of design, which relate to HOW you use the elements.




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
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
What are the dominant elements of art in these examples of Cristian's work?



- 3. **Decide** Is your sculpture a success? What do you like about it? Would you change anything if you did it again?

Name: Mrs. Hengesteg Title: Crazy Plant Lady

My origami sculpture is about the affinity I have for my houseplants. When we moved to Wyoming from Iowa 6 years ago, the back seat of my car was full of houseplants that I couldn't imagine leaving behind. When we moved to Evanston in 2019, I hauled twice as many plants and had to use a shelf and hanging baskets to fit all of them in the back of the car. Jokingly, I mentioned to a friend that I might be a "crazy plant lady" instead of a "crazy cat lady".

The crane is made from brown shopping bag paper because I wanted the crane to be a neutral color. I used watercolor paints on brown paper to make a variety of greens for the plants, as well as gray and terracotta colored paper for the pots. The plant forms are based on my real plants. I used a variety of textures and shapes to represent different types of succulents in my collection. The 3 pots on each wing gives the sculpture visual balance as well as physically balance, so the crane doesn't tip to one side.

I'm happy with the sculpture. It represents my story well and has the natural look I was going for. If I did this project again I would make the crane more precise. I used the first one I folded from brown paper, yet I could have folded a second one and been more careful with the folds.



Origami - Fly Forward (student example 2019)

The colors in this piece were used to describe a certain feeling. Yellow for the good and light that is still happening, and black for all the bad that has already happened. There are different textures, but mostly there are smooth edges with barely any sharp points. Everything is made out of different colored paper. The stitches appear are visible, they symbolize getting through anything, even though injuries can happen.

The meaning of this piece is something a little bit deeper. The butterfly has injuries. The open rib cage with the heart inside is meant to describe the feeling that the heart has been out in the open and put on the line, yet the butterfly still is flying forward. And even with the stitches, it won't let anyone, or anything, get it down.

This sculpture was a success in my opinion. It really gets the feeling I'm trying to get across very well. If I could change something I would make it just a bit smaller.
