Subject Introduction

Introduce the sub- Header you are going to be writing about.

Subject Introducti... 4 pts Relevant information to the topic that lead to the evidence. (3 sentence minimum).	Subject Introducti... 3 pts Provides sentence(s) that indicate what the paragraph will cover. (3 sentence minimum).	Subject introducti... 2 pts An incomplete sentence(s), or statement that has no relationship to the subject. (2 sentences).	Subject introduction 1 pt There is only one sentence that address the subject or that sentence has no relationship to topic.	Subject introducti... 0 pts No subject introduction.
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Transitions

Each fact introduced has a transition sentence entering the fact and leaving the fact.

Transition(s) 4 pts Consistently uses a variety of transitions to clarify the relationship between idea and concept. (minimum of 3 transition in(s) and 3 transition out(s)).	Transition(s) 3 pts There are transitions for each fact. The transitions must relate to the fact. (minimum of 3 transition in(s) and 3 transition out(s)).	Transition(s) 2 pts There are some key transitions missing from the paragraph. Either not enough or they do not relate to the fact.	Transition (s) 1 pt Transitions are missing from a majority of the paragraphs.	Transition (s) 0 pts There are fewer than 2 transitions or no transitions at all.
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Fact(s)

The key points of your paragraph that help the reader see the truth in your writing.

Fact(s) 4 pts Facts come from multiple valid/reliable sources (minimum 3 facts)	Fact(s) 3 pts The facts provided correspond with the topic for this paragraph (minimum 3 facts)	Fact(s) 2 pts There are facts though these facts do not relate to the topic/sub-header. (minimum 2 facts).	Fact(s) 1 pt What is thought to be a fact is actually not a fact at all.	Fact(s) 0 pts No facts are present.
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Reference

Cited where your fact(s) came from. Giving credit to other sources.

Reference(s) 4 pts Paraphrase and quotes are cited according to MLA formatting and math works cited.	Reference(s) 3 pts The facts have cited reference(s) that can include author and title of original article.	Reference(s) 2 pts The reference provided is incorrect and does not come from source stated.	Reference(s) 1 pt The reference provided is incomplete.	Reference(s) 0 pts No reference is stated.
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Closing Remarks

Sentences that wrap the entire paragraph into a few sentences. Highlighting the most important information from that section.

Closing Remark 4 pts The closing remarks wrap up information in the paragraph and include a transition to the next paragraph.	Closing Remark 3 pts The statements give a recap of the key points from the paragraph. (minimum of 3 sentences).	Closing Remark 2 pts The recap of the paragraph has no relationship to the topic/sub-header. (minimum of 3 sentences)	Closing Remark 1 pt The recap of the paragraph has no relationship to the topic/sub-header. (Less than 3 sentences)	Closing Remark 0 pts No closing remarks are included in the writing.
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
