

Common Assessment and Team Response Protocol

(Led by Teacher Teams)

This protocol is designed to help teacher teams quickly and efficiently discuss a common assessment. Prior to meeting:

1. Each teacher should review his or her own assessment data.
2. Each teacher should determine their individual list of students who need additional time and support, students who are on target (demonstrate minimal mastery), and students who need extension (demonstrate strong mastery and beyond).
