1. What is it we want the students to learn?

1. How do we know when they have learned it?

Essential standards were identified for both reading and math

How do we know when they have learned it?

Common formative assessments were created which can be quick checked by the instructor.

What do we do with the students that didn't learn it?

Tier 2 and Tier 3 instruction

What do we do with the students who did learn it?

Enrichment

So on collaboration Fridays.....

Thanks to you, the teachers can get together and look at the data from the common formative assessment (CFA).

Students can then be identified as mastering the essential standard or need Tier 2 instruction

Teachers share the strategies they used to get the students to learn the essential standard. If one teacher had great success in getting the students to master the CFA, they will share that strategy
