Social Studies Department

Description: The social studies department can best meet the needs of our students in need of extension by creating "interest centers" through our PlusTime selections during Tier 2.. The basis of this method is the encouragement of choice and extension. The goal of this method is to make connections to in-class content and extend learning. This semester, that has included:

- 1. Documentary Analysis
 - a. The teacher plays a documentary on topics discussed in class. Students have discussions during and after the documentary.
 - b. Google Forms documentary reflection example
- 2. Movie Analysis
 - a. The teacher plays a movie portraying a particular time period of study. Discussions over what is accurate and inaccurate based on what was discussed in class.
 - b. Cinderella Man analysis example
- 3. Current Events
 - a. The teacher shows a brief clip summarizing current news events. Discussions over the events include connections to in-class content.
