To achieve this goal....

Action Steps: What steps or activities will be initiated to achieve this goal?

- l. Begin implementation of the Debriefing DAILY so that HOTS are covered
- 2. Set a day and time and stick to Math Grade level planning where a rough outline will begin
- 3. Plan a day before Missions begin that we sit and evaluate Eureka Assessment and take notes on what edits need to be made to it.
- 4. Daily Debriefing should help students be able to explain how they arrived at an answer.

Time Frame: What is a realistic timeframe for each step/activity?

- l. Debriefing will begin immediately
- 2. Thursday Planning will be used to create outline of the next week's math lessons
- 3. Need to pace out Mission 3 and then create a day before we begin Mission 4 so that we can analyze Assessment. (Evaluation for Assessment on Mission 3 needs to happen ASAP.)

Expected outcomes:

- 1. Students will be better prepared for Assessments.
- 2. Planning will be easier on everyone and implementation of the lesson will be better.
- 3. Students will know exactly what they will be assessed on.
